A portion of the Ben F. Hunt Estate (see 618 Silver Street), a corner home at this location burned to the ground in November, 1964, and was replaced by this mobile home which was the residence of Ruth Hunt Lyke and her son, Claude F. Hunt, through the early 1980s. Jim Ryan looked after Mrs. Lyke and her son. Ryan was mystified after hearing gunshots from within the trailer following earthquake tremors which shook Lake City in the mid-1960s. Asked why he was shooting through the floor of the trailer, Claude Hunt responded that he was attempting to kill the "damn pack rats" which persisted in shaking the trailer from beneath the floor. Following Ruth Hunt Lyke's death in 1984, the mobile home was sold to its current owner, Teresa Carl Quintana, who uses it as a rental.

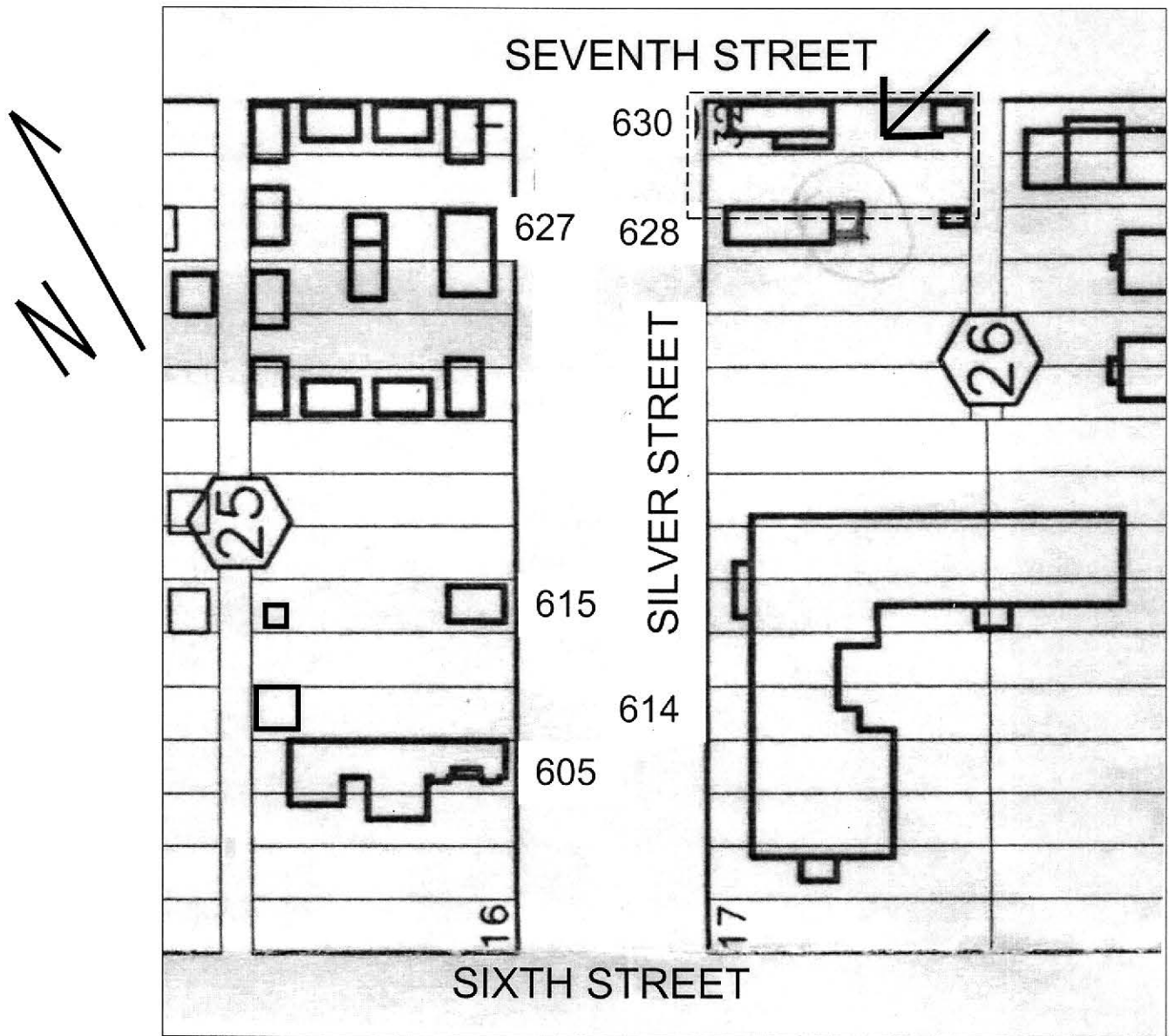
