

Public works Report – November 2025

During the month of November, the Town of Lake City produced 12,054,000 gallons of safe drinking water. The Wastewater Treatment Plant processed 7,000,149 gallons of wastewater. For comparison, in November of last year, the Town produced 16,015,300 gallons of water and processed 2,318,893 gallons of wastewater. This shows great improvement of the WWTF.

Water: Public Works has been planning for the construction of a new water fill station with the assistance of Joanne. Pricing for the electrical service is currently being determined. The proposed location is on the east side of the Henson street right of way just north of the med center lots and directly to the right of the existing trail. The Ballfield Well has been shut off for the time being to reduce electrical expenses. The well will be turned on once at the beginning of every other billing period and again at the end to insure that it is completely operational. Additionally, the County Admin Building has officially been connected to the Town's water system.

Wastewater: Public Works has completed jetting of problem lines in preparation for winter. The County Admin Building has also been connected to the Town's wastewater system.

Streets and Alleys: In preparation for winter plowing, exposed manholes have been buried or marked with delineators. Third Street had multiple temporary closures during the week of the 9th to allow for necessary work and public safety.

Other: Public Works has submitted the permit application for the Ski Hill Well and will keep the Town Trustees updated on its approval status.
