So if you have concerns about public health or safety or of an unreasonable risk of nuisance to the neighborhood then you will need to outline them either in writing or in person at the hearing or both. # **Town of Lake City Suburban Usage Policy**

It is the Town of Lake City's goal to allow use of the suburban to authorized groups when it is not in use by the Town of Lake City Parks and Recreation Department or another Town department.

Ownership: The suburban is owned by the Town of Lake City.

Management: The suburban shall be managed in accordance with this policy by the Town of Lake City.

**Town Insurance**: The suburban will be insured by the Town of Lake City. Any person or organization renting the suburban will also have their or its own insurance that covers use of the van.

Maintenance: The Town of Lake City shall perform regular and routine maintenance and repairs on the suburban as needed.

**Authorized Users:** An authorized user of the suburban shall have a driver that The Town of Lake City has pre-authorized to drive the vehicle. The suburban must be scheduled in advance with the Town office. Parks and Recreation activities will take precedence for use of the vehicle.

The suburban will be reserved on a first come first serve basis. Although ongoing known usages will not be bumped no matter how far in advance another user makes a reservation.

The following is a list of many of the groups that will potentially be allowed to use the suburban. This list isn't all inclusive.

Hinsdale County, Lake City Community School, Public Health, DIRT, Veteran Affairs, The trail shuttle group, etc. Also non profit groups or other groups with charitable purposes that are beneficial to the Town of Lake City and Hinsdale County. **The suburban is not for private use.** Except as set forth above, the suburban will not be available for use by individuals, families, or for-profit groups. Opening the van to use by these groups would cause overuse, excessive wear and tear, and expose the Town to unnecessary liability.

#### Reservations:

Reservations are accepted by phone or in person at the Town office Monday through Friday 8am – 5pm.

970-944-2333. This will be on a first come first serve basis. If two or more organizations request the same dates and times the Parks and Recreation Director will decide who takes priority based on past usage and the priority of the requested usage. Users may pick up the keys at the Town office during normal business hours on the day of the trip, or if necessary the night before or on a Friday if the suburban is being used on a weekend.

#### **Driver Qualifications:**

Suburban drivers must be pre screened by the Town prior to using the suburban. Drivers must have a current and valid Colorado driver's license and have valid motor vehicle insurance covering physical damage to the vehicle and personal injury coverage for any and all passengers.

#### Cost of Use:

The suburban will be full of fuel upon release to the user and must be returned full of fuel. If it is being used for a rec sponsored trip the user may need to arrange fuel with the Parks and Recreation Department.

All fees including but not limited to toll fees, parking fees, towing fees, moving violations, speeding tickets, etc. shall be the sole responsibility of the driver and/or the organization using the suburban.

#### **Payment of Funds:**

Funds, including donations, collected for the use of the van shall be paid to the Town office. These funds are needed for the repair and maintenance of the vehicle.

#### **Record Keeping:**

A mileage log shall be kept in the suburban and filled out by each and every user immediately after each use.

A passenger trip log shall be kept by each and every user that includes the name, address, and phone number of each passenger.

#### **Driver Safety:**

The driver responsible for the suburban and its passengers shall:

Schedule the use of the suburban in advance.

Complete a pre trip safety check before each day's use of the vehicle, including but not limited to checking the oil level and doing a walk around of the vehicle checking for damage.

Maintain the passenger trip log.

Assist passengers on and off the vehicle.

Collect donations to be handed in to the Town later.

Ensure seatbelts are being used by all passengers and the driver.

Refuel the vehicle after use.

#### **Passenger Safety:**

All passengers of the suburban shall:

Comply with the requests and instructions of the driver.

Wear seatbelts at all times.

Remain seated with seatbelts fastened while the vehicle is in motion.

#### **Safety Equipment:**

Due to the mountainous climate in which we live, the suburban should always be equipped with a flashlight, someone with a cell phone, water sufficient for a 24 hour period, large blankets, and a first aid kit. If you find that anything is missing or needed prior to your trip, please ask the Town for assistance.

#### Maintenance:

The Town will provide basic maintenance for the suburban, including oil and filter changes, tire replacement and rotation, and other maintenance.

#### Restrictions on travel:

Travel in the suburban shall be limited to a distance of 200 miles from Lake City. If travel is needed farther away, a user may ask for permission from the Town.

#### **Operator Insurance Requirement:**

Operators are required to have insurance that covers the use of the suburban, including but not limited to, property damage coverage for the replacement value of the van, along with personal injury coverage for the driver and all the passengers.

#### **Rental Agreement:**

The organization and/or individual using the van shall fill out and sign the Town of Lake City Suburban Use Agreement.

#### **Indemnification of the Town of Lake City:**

The driver of the suburban and/or the organization renting the suburban shall agree to indemnify and hold harmless The Town of Lake City, Colorado and its agents, officers, elected officials, and employees, from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, arising out of their use of the suburban, that is for bodily injury, illness, or death, or for property damage, including loss of use, caused in whole or in part by negligent or intentional act(s) or omission(s) by the driver of the suburban or any passenger of the suburban, or that of anyone else affiliated with the organization using the suburban, or that of anyone employed by them or for whose acts such organization may be liable.

# Lake City Emergency Preparedness in Reference to Emergency Alert and Communication

There is a very smart American saying: "Don't put all your eggs in one basket". In the Silver World newspaper from December 30, 2022, is an article regarding the new Emergency Alert System. No matter how sophisticated this system is, it all depends on a working phone network. Most all municipalities in the US are served by at least two independent communication line, (Optic Fibers). Unfortunately this is not the case in Lake City, CO 81235. We are at the end of a single line which comes all the way from Montrose. Some of you may remember when the optic fiber was installed. For a long time a crew worked with a trench cutting machine parallel to the highway. As you can imagine over this long distance to Montrose there is a good chance this optic fiber gets damaged. Last year we already experienced a total blackout in our valley when an excavating machine in Cimarron ripped the optic fiber in pieces. You may think in such case you can use your cellular phone. No this is also not working. All communication to and from the cellular tower goes through the Lake City central office which is owned by CenturyLink. Although most all of this optical fiber is underground there is one critical spot above ground. Near the location of the former "High Bridge" which was used to bring the train service to Lake City, such optical fiber is crossing the valley. A wild fire in this are will also cut off Lake City from all communication. Yes there are a few Satellite phone owners in our area. However these few phone cannot serve as an emergency information and communication system.

Last year I was informed by a CenturyLink employee about plans to install an optic fiber coming from the south all the way over Slumgullion pass. As a result of the very high costs it is very questionable if such second communication line is available in the near future.

What are the possibilities for not having all eggs in one basket?

Back in the year of 2000, my business "Tripod Group Inc." entered into a contract with the Town of Lake City to install a photo voltaic system on Round Top Mountain to supply power for the FM and TV repeater site. Later such contract was extended at multiple costs of the photo voltaic system to expand and upgrade the entire repeater site. Back then we had 4 radio stations and 3 television stations serving Lake City. In 2001, my late wife Ursula and I worked on a voluntary basis on Round Top mountain to install an emergency broadcast system.

How does it work: The city, the sheriff office and the employee of Hinsdale county in charge of emergency service had a little hand-held 2 way radio, (only the transmitting part was used), working in the UHF band. As soon such a radio was switched to transmit the input from the KVLE translator working on 106.3MHz was switch over to the output of the receiver installed to receive the signals from such hand-held radios. This way the city employees, Sheriff office employees and Hinsdale County employees in charge with emergencies could at any time transmit messages to be

received by any cheap FM radios such as emergency radios with multiple power options, and certainly by any car radios or tuners of stereo systems.

As a result of frequent employee changes in the town as well as county government, and some animosity between these two government agencies the setup on Round Top Mountain has deteriorated. Knowing about the importance of this emergency broadcast system I tried to reactivate the service. Mr. Jerry Gray tried to get the key for the Round Top equipment building from the city office. The town manager back then, (at my best recall Ms. L Klusmeier), refused our request saying the city has nothing to do with this emergency broad cast system, insisting the county is in charge of this equipment.

Wrong, the city owns the building, and all equipment is this building as well as the entire photo-voltaic system, wind turbine, and antenna setups, which is not owned the by KVNF radio station. The town of Lake City is also holding the FCC License for the translator working at 106.3 MHz. I urge town and county government to work together to reinstate, and if beneficiary to upgrade this very important emergency broadcast system.

For many weeks during the summer of 2022, the KVNF translator was down. I started then communicating with Jeff Reynolds of KVNF. He said he will come to Lake City and will go to Round Top Mountain with some local people to repair the setup. Shortly after this repeater failed again and since that time up to the current day we do not have wireless KVNF radio available. Mr. Reynolds referred to internet service, means another egg in the same basket. We should have at least two working FM translators on Round Top, one for the local emergency broadcast system and one to receive alerts from the US emergency service network. It seems to me KVNF radio station is not very eager to maintain wireless service for Lake City. If so I suggest Lake City takes over all KVNF equipment for \$ 1.00 as well as the license to operate this translator.

Many emergencies in the US caused very fast a total failure of the telephone/internet networks for land-lines as well as wireless operated equipment. This is the moment where the American radio amateurs providing the very much needed communication service, mostly by use of shortwave bands, besides some VHF repeater networks as far as such a network is available in the disaster area. As soon an emergency is declared the FCC is assigning exclusive frequencies specifically for day and night operation. This service of the radio amateurs is very power full because of the ability to communicate wireless also over long distance if necessary. In contrary to the old "time" wireless communication can be by phone, RTTY, (teletype) mode, various digital modes and exchange of pictures as well as email. By use of and interface any computer can be connected to amateur radio transceivers to allow such digital communication.

Before relocating to the USA to work as an engineer in electronics and computer science in a specific field of electronics/computers improving special textile products I was living in Switzerland. When I served in the signal corp of the Swiss army I was in charge of special wireless communications equipment in the connection with scrambling equipment. After my honorable discharge as result of a back injury during my service, I was assigned to the Swiss Civil Protection agency where I served as the chief officer for emergency communication in a town near Zurich.

After locating to Lake City I became aware of the need for some kind of emergency communication. I obtained my operator license and went through all levels to get the highest license, means the Extra Class License. With the help of my late wife Ursula we put built a little shed especially to serve as a radio station. At the same time I installed a 900 watt photo-voltaic system to generate power to operate this station independent of grid power. Two months ago I upgraded the battery bank with LiFePO4 batteries with a total capacity of 10,000Wh. This setup is now good to work far beyond my life expectancy. I invite people interested to operate this radio station if an emergency requests such shortwave communication. Please contact me by email bay18shop@centurytel.net

Here is some information about flooding. In 2021, was a tremendous flooding in Germany in a valley named "Ahrtal" leading to total devastation and many souls lost. In a very short time all communication was lost and people living further down the valley could not be warned. I will leave a collection of pictures with the city hall. Looking at these pictures you may conclude this catastrophic event was triggered by a broken dam higher up in the valley. No it was just some very heavy rain in a certain area which triggered this tremendous devastation. As a result of climate changes we will see more often such heavy cloud bursts. If this occurs on our side of Engineer Pass and Cinnamon Pass maybe stretching as far a Slumgullion pass we will experiencing flooding all over town which will disable the central office from CenturyLink. The German government learned the hard way that a telephone, (land-line as well as cellular service), is not enough to alert and inform the public of danger. Now sirens are installed which have been removed after WW2. Hearing the sound of such sirens means switch on your portable radios!

I really hope my article will lead to a setup where not all eggs are in one basket, means bring the emergency broadcast system back to life.

Hi folks,

I recently received the attached article from Rolf Glockner (bless his heart; and those who know him will understand my comment). Reading the article will give you a sense of why I say that, if you are not acquainted. We emailed back and forth on the subject and he piqued my interest in getting involved again.

In a nut shell, all telephone communication in Lake City and the valley, and that includes cell phones and hence the new Emergency Alert system, it all depends on that one fiber optic cable between Montrose and Lake City. It has been cut before and when that single point of failure is broken you have no way of communicating with your constituents.

However we have had a novel work around for decades, thankfully it has not been needed yet. The fact that it has not been needed or used adds to the lack of awareness of this asset. The Town of Lake City owns the translator on Round Top for the Grand Junction FM radio station at 106.3. Unlike KVNF, 106.3 is seldom down and is always loud and clear. There is a radio relay installed (see attachment) and that will break in on the radio station broad cast through the use of hand held radios in town. There were two but I only know the location of the one at the Sheriff's Office now.


When cell phones are down, and they go down for reasons other than a failure in that fiber cable, this is a way for the PIO to communicate with the community. When I was serving as Emergency Manager and before we had sirens in town, we held community exercises where we coordinated the ringing of all of the church bells (we had a system for that) with a test broadcast on 106.3.

So I went to the SO and Bobbi and I found the radio unplugged and not charged. We charged it up and tested it but the system is no longer working. Rolf suspects that it is just a battery at the site that needs to be replaced. I don't believe that it is urgent enough to try to get someone up there this winter, but when we can get up there, it would behoove us to check on it. I have worked on it with Rolf in the past and will be glad to help in any way that I can.

Thanks for considering this.

Jerry,

First of all, thank you for sharing this information with us and your continued support of Hinsdale County and Lake City. I do have a couple of comments regarding your message that I want to share and also correct so that no further misinformation is spread throughout the county.

- 1. I have never heard of anything related to the Tripod project mentioned and I cannot find it written in any of our emergency plans or other Emergency Response related documents. Do you have any further documentation that you can share so we can investigate this system? We would certainly like to have all available communication methods incorporated into our plans.
- 2. While you and Mr. Glockner's comments on the cellular situation are accurate, Hinsdale County has grown leaps and bounds in the last three plus years with regards to emergency response and don't want that hard work to be tarnished by misconceptions or misinformation being spread.
  - a. Those that live in Hinsdale County, or any remote location for that matter, take on a certain amount of risk. Most of our residents have educated themselves and prepared for the "what if's" that can occur when you choose to live in such a place. This however does not preclude us as emergency response agencies to plan for the "what if's" as well.
  - b. Hinsdale County's emergency response agencies (Sheriff's Office, EMS, Fire, OEM and the new Coroner) have been feverishly working to update plans, write and implement new plans and in many cases exercise those plans to identify gaps and needed updates to plans.
- 3. In 2022 this group updated and conducted a tabletop exercise of the Hinsdale County Alert and Warning Plan. This is just one of five plans that were updated in CY22. Part of this updated plan was addressing the exact concern your email brings up, redundant communications and public messaging. Here are a few highlights Instead of reciting the entire plan and exercise in this email:
  - a. Cellular service is only one of the primary platforms our new messaging system utilizes. Residents have the ability to register land lines, cell phones, text/SMS enabled devices and email addresses. While most of these platforms require cellular service, many of our residents have registered emails which in lots of cases utilize a non-cellular service for use.
  - b. ALL landlines have been automatically registered into the GEM system without any registration required. Therefore all residents who still have landlines (as mentioned in your email) will automatically receive emergency alerts through the GEM system.
  - c. Since mid-2019 Hinsdale County has had the ability to send emergency alert messages through the WEA and iPAWS systems.
    - WEA is a public safety system that allows customers who own mobile devices to receive geographically targeted, text-like messages alerting them of imminent threats to safety in their area. These alerts do not require registration and can be transmitted through cellular towers not in the immediate area. Yes, if the tower in Lake City went down the immediate Lake City area would be affected, but areas to the north and south would still receive messages through towers in those locations.
    - The Integrated Public Alert & Warning System (IPAWS) is FEMA's national system for local alerting that provides authenticated emergency and life-saving information to the public through mobile phones using Wireless Emergency Alerts, to radio and television via the Emergency Alert System, and on the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Weather Radio. This system does exactly what Mr. Glockner set out to perform, except it has the ability to broadcast to a much broader audience. Instead of only being able to broadcast to the immediate Lake City area, our

system can be shared to radio and television networks from the western Slope to the front Range simultaneously.

- d. Hinsdale, Mineral and Saguache County OEM's are part of a communications working group that has been working with the State Office of Information Technology (OIT), cellular, fiber and satellite agencies to conduct a tri-county assessment of the current communications situation and ongoing needs. We recently received the final report from OIT and that report has been shared with the County Commissioners to review and comment on. We have an ongoing effort to improve communications of all types in Hinsdale County partnered through the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management.
- e. Finally, we also have multiple radio systems that can be used to share emergency information not only in the county, but state-wide. The drawback of this system is that 99% of our residents do not have access to these radios, but it allows us contact with our mutual-aid and state-wide partners who can then help us spread the message as best we can. The county has also been working closely with our BLM partners to construct a new tower on Hill 71 that is scheduled to go live in 2024.

The real message here is that Hinsdale County is a very remote location that is obviously susceptible to catastrophic failures in communications. I hope this update gives you a better understanding of some of the work that has been completed and continues daily. Please share this information with Mr. Glockner so that he does not continue to think that Hinsdale County or Lake City has "put all of their eggs in one basket". You are more than welcome to give Mr. Glockner my contact information so that we can discuss this topic directly.



Phil,

First of all, it seems I owe you an apology. It was not my intention to impugn your work and cause you to be so defensive. My intention was only to point out a possible problem, and the work around for that particular problem that has been in place and working for many years now, and to encourage maintaining the system. You obviously took offense to Rolf's "all eggs in one basket" characterization. I think you took it in a boarder context than it was intended. We aren't saying that nothing else is being done, only that we have a potential problem with all cellular communication and a solution is at hand if we maintain it.

- 1. Any documentation from the installation by Tripod would be with the Town records. I would be glad to show you the physical system next time you are in town... If that happens to be after the snow melts, we can run up to Round Top and check it out together. It is a very effective tool if we maintain and use it.
- 2. As you said, our "comments on the cellular situation are accurate", period.
  - a. This solves one of those "what if's".
- b. Those are things that should be happening, and good for you, but they have nothing to do with the subject at hand.
- 3. These are all things that a full time Emergency Manager should be doing.
- a. The only thing in this list that does not need that fiber optic connection to Montrose are those non-cellular wifi services such as Simply Broadband. But again, no text or cell phone coverage.
  - b. All land lines need that fiber optic connection. GEM needs that fiber optic connection.
- c. WEA and IPAWS cannot reach mobile phones if there is no cell service. Do we have NOAA Weather Radio now? I worked for years to bring it here. That's awesome if you accomplished it but I have not heard any announcement, if that is the case.
- d. This is all good and what you should be doing. If improved communications is part of your ongoing effort this project should be near the top.
- e. Again, this is all good and as it should be, but have no connection to the effort to maintain and expand the use of this very valuable tool that we have.

I am sorry that you took this personally. It was intended to raise awareness and support for a very valuable asset that we have.

Jerry,

Neither I nor the Emergency Services group in Hinsdale County have anything to hide, so transparency is no problem at all. As I stated in my first response to your emails "The real message here is that Hinsdale County is a very remote location that is obviously susceptible to catastrophic failures in communications." Let me answer your questions in a few ways so you have an even more clear understanding of the situation.

- 1. Our Alert and Warning Plan, as I laid out for you in my original response, presents multiple "solutions" and options should the fiber line be cut or any other linty of communications loss occur. For reference, this plan did not exist prior to 2019.
- 2. If you are implying that the Tripod system at the Sheriff's Office is the solution to this problem; why is it not captured in any plans, written down anywhere or a system that has been kept up to date or maintained? The WEA and iPAWS systems are national systems that have proven to be more sophisticated, tested, updated and maintained systems compared to the Tripod system described in your email. The best part of this is that none of the cost or responsibility for these systems fall on counties. You yourself stated that you went to the Sheriff's Office

- and found this system inoperable. I know nothing about Tripod and it is not an OEM system, so I will end this portion with that statement.
- 3. 911/Emergency communications in Colorado is actually the responsibility of the Sheriff's Office, not OEM. Since Gunnison County dispatches for Hinsdale County the true responsibility falls on them to ensure that service is maintained, tested and updated. The Sheriff and Under-Sheriff participate in a communications board that oversees the 911/communications services in Hinsdale County, so please feel free to refer some of your questions to them as they will have these answers.

Jerry, I think it is obvious that if all cellular service to Hinsdale County is disrupted by some type of incident; than text, cellular and messaging will be impacted. But, as I also mentioned in my response, there are other services in Hinsdale County that do not depend on the fiber line. For example, if there is internet service available than text and calls over the internet, known as VOIP, would still be available.

To summarize, I feel as though I have not only answered your questions but further educated you on some of the other services that have been implemented in the county by the Emergency Services group.

Hey folks,

First of all, I apologize to you. It was never my intention to invite you to watch, or much less have myself get drawn into a circular argument with no end in sight. My intention was to raise awareness of this unique asset and garner support for this valuable, REDUNDANT, means of communication to your constituents during emergencies. This is a valuable tool. Another tool for the tool box. Imagine my surprise when I am met with argument from the Emergency Manager, of all folks! His abject refusal to learn anything about the asset stuns me. I hope the rest of you will be more open minded. As he stated in #3 in his last response, emergency communications is not his responsibility (news to me) so there is no need to keep him in this conversation.

As luck would have it, the recent power outage has provided a perfect example of the advantage of this tool and the shortcomings of GEMS and other cell and text notification systems. Power went off at our cabin, here in Lake City, at around 1 AM, we noticed it sometime around 3, we got up and saw an even more amazingly dark sky night in town. We had no wifi and I checked my cell phone and tested texting and calling, both of which failed. I went out to my truck and checked FM 106.3 on the radio. It was loud and clear.

Around 10 that morning cell service and texting came back. Later, almost exactly 12 hours after the event began, the first GEMs alert was received in town. Power outages are slow moving emergencies, however wildland/urban fires or floods are not. There was a 9 hour gap between 1 and 10 when there was no way of communicating with your constituents via text, cell phone or land line, from Lake City, Akron or anyplace else. 106.3 FM was loud and clear the whole time and you have the tool to use it, if you maintain it, inform the community about it, write it into plans, and exercise it. The only people that I know of in Lake City who do not have a vehicle and hence an FM radio are Marty and Gabriel. Country music is not my favorite and I don't know if many folks in town listen to 106.3 on a regular basis but if the community is

aware that emergency messaging is available there during an event they would tune in. The main complaint that Elaine and I are hearing around town is that it took 12 hours to receive the first emergency notification.

The system has worked for decades, with one replacement of the two town radios for a few hundred bucks. Bobbi and various deputies through the years have tested it with me. We exercised it with the community but never wrote it into plans and I will take the blame for that; EM was a part time job at that point and EMS, the other part, was taking a lot of my attention, not to mention my Coroner duties. The issue with the system now is likely battery replacement which should not be pricey. I encourage you to look into this system and support it. I will do anything that I can to answer questions and help put this tool back in the tool box. I will try to talk with each of you individually as I see you around town.

Sec. 14-203. - Prohibition of certain marijuana businesses and operations.

- (a) *General provisions*. No license to establish, operate, continue to operate or permit to be operated any medical marijuana center, optional premises cultivation operation or medical marijuana-infused products manufacturing or sale facility shall be lawful in the town. No person shall thereafter maintain any such business or operation or any other enterprise engaged in the possession, use, cultivation, production, sale or distribution of marijuana or marijuana products other than those which are properly conducted by patients and primary caregivers as expressly allowed by, and specifically conforming with, the provisions of article XVIII, section 14 of the state constitution and related state laws and regulations. (The overall intent of this section is to fully exercise the town's local option specifically allowed under C.R.S. § 12-43.3-106. No intent to deprive or limit the rights of medical marijuana patients and their primary caregivers established under the state constitution or related state law and regulations shall be inferred from this section.)
- (b) Declaration of nuisance and enforcement remedies. Any violation of this section is hereby declared to be a public nuisance subject to injunction and abatement in any lawful manner. In this regard, the town may pursue any one or more of the following specific civil remedies in addition to all sanctions available through the state criminal courts:
  - (1) It may maintain a civil action in any court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin or abate the nuisance.
  - (2) With a prior court order, it may enter upon private property on which the nuisance is being maintained for the purpose of performing all work necessary to abate or eliminate the nuisance. The town's municipal court is hereby expressly empowered to issue orders for entry into private property upon showing of probable cause to believe that a nuisance is being maintained thereon in violation of this section.
  - (3) In all nuisance abatement or elimination actions properly taken under this section, the town shall be entitled to recover all costs that it reasonably incurs for such actions, plus interest at the rate then allowed by law. Such costs which may be recovered by the town shall include, without limitation, its out-of-pocket expenses, costs attributable to town employee time and equipment use, attorney's fees, and a charge for overhead and administration equal to 20 percent of the base costs for the abatement or elimination of the specific nuisance. Said costs may be recovered by customary enforcement of a civil judgment which may be collected and foreclosed in any manner provided by law. They may also be certified to the treasurer of the county for assessment and collection as delinquent charges in the same manner as taxes upon the property on which the subject nuisance had been maintained.
- (c) Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Marijuana or useable form of marijuana (sometimes spelled "marihuana" or referred to by the scientific name of "cannabis sativa"), medical use, patient and primary caregiver shall have the same meanings as those terms are defined by said article XVIII, section 14(1) of the state constitution.

Medical marijuana, medical marijuana center, medical marijuana-infused product, medical marijuana-infused product manufacturer and optional premises cultivation operation shall have the same meanings as those terms are defined by C.R.S. § 12-43-101 et seq., as supplemented by any regulations lawfully adopted by authority of said state statutes.

*Person* means any natural person, partnership, association, company, corporation, limited liability company or other organization or entity, and shall include a manager, agent, owner, officer or an employee of such organization or entity.

*Possess* or *possession* means having physical control of a pertinent substance or product controlled by this section, or control of the premises in which such substance or product is located or having the power and intent to control such substance or product, without regard to whether the one in possession has actual ownership of such substance or product. Possession may be held by more than one person at a time. Direct consumption or use of the pertinent substance or product is not required for purposes of determining its possession.

#### Produce or production means:

- a. All phases of growth of marijuana from seed to harvest;
- b. Combining marijuana with any other substance for sale or distribution, including storage and packaging for resale; and
- c. Preparing, compounding, processing, and encapsulating, packaging, or re-packaging, labeling or re-labeling of any marijuana or its derivatives, whether alone or mixed with any amount of any other substance or product.
- (2) All other pertinent definitions provided in C.R.S. § 12-43.3-101 et seq., are adopted by this section unless expressly stated otherwise herein.

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# BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HINSDALE COUNTY, COLORADO

ORDINANCE NO. 1 - 20\3

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPERATION OF MARIJUANA CULTIVATION FACILITIES, MARIJUANA PRODUCT MANUFACTURING FACILITIES, MARIJUANA TESTING FACILITIES AND MARIJUANA RETAIL STORES IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF HINSDALE COUNTY, COLORADO

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Hinsdale County, Colorado ("Board") has the authority to exercise decision-making powers for the unincorporated areas of Hinsdale County, Colorado pursuant to C.R.S. §§ 30-11-101, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, on November 6, 2012, the voters of the State of Colorado approved Amendment 64 to the State's Constitution allowing for the personal use and regulation of marijuana; and

WHEREAS, Amendment 64 will add a new Section 16 to Article XVIII of the Colorado Constitution; and

WHEREAS, part 5(f) of Section 16 of Article XVIII allows a "locality", such as a county, to prohibit the operation of marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities, and marijuana retail stores through the enactment of an ordinance; and

WHEREAS, at the November 6, 2012 election, approximately fifty-two percent (52%) of the Hinsdale County electorate voted against Amendment 64; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the authority granted to the Board by Amendment 64, and given the will of the Hinsdale County voters, the Board desires to adopt this Ordinance to prohibit the operation of marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities and retail marijuana stores within the unincorporated areas of Hinsdale County, Colorado; and

WHEREAS, the Board deems this Ordinance to be in the best interests of the public health, safety and welfare of Hinsdale County, Colorado.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF HINSDALE COUNTY, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Ordinance is to promote the public health, welfare and safety of Hinsdale County, Colorado by prohibiting the operation of marijuana cultivation facilities, marijuana product manufacturing facilities, marijuana testing facilities and retail marijuana stores within the unincorporated areas of Hinsdale County, Colorado.
- 2. <u>Applicability.</u> This Ordinance shall apply to the unincorporated areas of Hinsdale County, Colorado.

- 3. <u>Definitions.</u> Unless otherwise specified, any terms used herein shall have the same meanings as provided in Article XVIII, Section 16 of the Colorado Constitution. These definitions include, but are not limited to, the following:
- 3.1 "Marijuana" or "marihuana" means all parts of the plant of the genus cannabis whether growing or not, the seeds thereof, the resin extracted from any part of the plant, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or its resin, including marijuana concentrate. "Marijuana" or "marihuana" does not include industrial hemp, nor does it include fiber produced from the stalks, oils, or cake made from the seeds of the plant, sterilized seed of the plant which is incapable of germination, or the weight of any other ingredient combined with marijuana to prepare topical or oral administrations, food, drink, or other products.
- 3.2 "Marijuana accessories" means any equipment, products, or materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propogating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, composting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, vaporizing, or containing marijuana, or for ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana into the human body.
- 3.3 "Marijuana cultivation facility" means an entity licensed to cultivate, prepare, and package marijuana and sell marijuana to retail marijuana stores, to marijuana product manufacturing facilities, and to other marijuana cultivation facilities, but not to consumers.
- 3.4 "Marijuana establishment" means a marijuana cultivation facility, a marijuana testing facility, a marijuana product manufacturing facility, or a retail marijuana store.
- 3.5 "Marijuana product manufacturing facility" means an entity licensed to purchase marijuana; manufacture, prepare, and package marijuana products; and sell marijuana and marijuana products to other marijuana product manufacturing facilities and to retail marijuana stores, but not to consumers.
- 3.6 "Marijuana products" means concentrated marijuana products and marijuana products that are comprised of marijuana and other ingredients and are intended for use or consumption, such as, but not limited to, edible products, ointments, and tinctures.
- 3.7 "Marijuana testing facility" means an entity licensed to analyze and certify the safety and potency of marijuana.
- 3.8 "Retail marijuana store" means an entity licensed to purchase marijuana from marijuana cultivation facilities, and marijuana and marijuana products from marijuana product manufacturing facilities, and to sell marijuana and marijuana products to consumers.
- 4. <u>Enforcement.</u> This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Hinsdale County Sheriff's Department.
- 5. <u>Violation.</u> It shall be unlawful for any person or entity to violate any provision of this Ordinance. If any person or entity is convicted of violating this Ordinance, the fine for a first offense and for any subsequent offense shall be ONE THOUSAND and oo/100 U.S. Dollars

(\$1,000.00) per violation, and each day a violation continues after notice thereof shall be deemed a separate violation. Unless otherwise provided by law, all fines and penalties of this Ordinance shall be paid into the treasury of Hinsdale County, Colorado.

- 6. <u>Surcharges.</u> In addition to the fines and penalties described in Section 5 above, any person or entity convicted of a violation of this Ordinance shall be subject to the statutory surcharges of TEN and 00/100 U.S. Dollars (\$10.00) for the Victims and Witnesses Assistance and Law Enforcement Fund, and FIFTEEN and 00/100 U.S. Dollars (\$15.00) for the Colorado Traumatic Brain Injury Trust Fund. Such surcharges shall be paid to the clerk of the court by each person or entity convicted of violating this Ordinance. The clerk of the court shall transmit such surcharge moneys to the respective funds in accordance with C.R.S. § 30-15-402(2).
- 7. <u>Severability.</u> If any part or parts of this Ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalid provision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Lake City Wastewater Treatment Plant Update – 2/12/23

Prepared by: Joanne Fagan

Michelle and Joanne spoke with our CDPHE contact, Erick Worker, about how best to proceed with securing the equipment for the wastewater treatment plant. Both of our funding agencies require that purchases of equipment be consistent with Town purchasing policies and be open for competition. However since the Town has already solicited proposals for the equipment essentially twice, Erick said that we had satisfied the solicitation process and could now negotiate to purchase the equipment. Erick cautioned that staff be sure to keep the Trustees in the loop as we proceed.

Joanne reached out to the two vendors who have expressed interest in the project. Joanne and Michelle had a conversation with one of the vendors and that vendor is going to update its design calculations and associated rough budget numbers and get something back to us this week. The other vendor is not really wanting to modify their off the shelf treatment package but is going to provide more references for us to check to determine whether their stock system is appropriate for the treatment needs for Lake City.

We are hoping to have additional information about both packages by the end of the week or early next. If neither looks to be something that we feel is acceptable, staff will likely start to incorporate selection and procurement of the equipment package into the general contractor's scope of work.

Regarding the financing for the project, the Town received draft SRF loan documents last week. It shows the total loan approved is for \$3,016,500 with an up front principal forgiveness of \$1,500,000. The balance of the loan will be a 20 year loan at 2% interest. That results in an annual payment of about \$94,000. As bad as that sounds, it is a little less than we had the cash flow worksheet shared with the Trustees a few weeks back.





Dear Mr. Lipsey:

On January 25, 2023, the Board of Directors of the Colorado Water Resources and Power Development Authority approved the Town of Lake City for a WPCRF Disadvantaged Communities Program direct loan in the principal amount of \$3,016,500.00 (Base WPCRF direct loan for \$138,948.98 and WPCRF Bipartisan Infrastructure Law ("BIL") General Supplemental direct loan for \$1,377,551.02) of which amount includes up to \$1,500,000.00 of up-front BIL principal forgiveness ("PF"). The loan is for a term of up to 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. Actual Base and BIL General Supplemental direct loan and PF amounts may be adjusted by a de minimis amount during the loan agreement negotiation process. The loan was approved with the following conditions: the Town's water and sewer rates are increased to meet the loan's 110% rate covenant requirement.

### **Town of Lake City Suburban Usage Policy**

It is the Town of Lake City's goal to allow use of the suburban to authorized groups when it is not in use by the Town of Lake City Parks and Recreation Department or another Town department.

Ownership: The suburban is owned by the Town of Lake City.

Management: The suburban shall be managed in accordance with this policy by the Town of Lake City.

**Town Insurance**: The suburban will be insured by the Town of Lake City. Any person or organization renting the suburban will also have their or its own insurance that covers use of the van.

Maintenance: The Town of Lake City shall perform regular and routine maintenance and repairs on the suburban as needed.

**Authorized Users:** An authorized user of the suburban shall have a driver that The Town of Lake City has pre-authorized to drive the vehicle. The suburban must be scheduled in advance with the Town office. Parks and Recreation activities will take precedence for use of the vehicle.

The suburban will be reserved on a first come first serve basis. Although ongoing known usages will not be bumped no matter how far in advance another user makes a reservation.

The following is a list of many of the groups that will potentially be allowed to use the suburban. This list isn't all inclusive.

Hinsdale County, Lake City Community School, Public Health, DIRT, Veteran Affairs, The trail shuttle group, etc. Also non profit groups or other groups with charitable purposes that are beneficial to the Town of Lake City and Hinsdale County. **The suburban is not for private use.** Except as set forth above, the suburban will not be available for use by individuals, families, or for-profit groups. Opening the van to use by these groups would cause overuse, excessive wear and tear, and expose the Town to unnecessary liability.

#### Reservations:

Reservations are accepted by phone or in person at the Town office Monday through Friday 8am – 5pm.

970-944-2333. This will be on a first come first serve basis. If two or more organizations request the same dates and times the Parks and Recreation Director will decide who takes priority based on past usage and the priority of the requested usage. Users may pick up the keys at the Town office during normal business hours on the day of the trip, or if necessary the night before or on a Friday if the suburban is being used on a weekend.

#### **Driver Qualifications:**

Suburban drivers must be pre screened by the Town prior to using the suburban. Drivers must have a current and valid Colorado driver's license and have valid motor vehicle insurance covering physical damage to the vehicle and personal injury coverage for any and all passengers.

#### Cost of Use:

The suburban will be full of fuel upon release to the user and must be returned full of fuel. If it is being used for a rec sponsored trip the user may need to arrange fuel with the Parks and Recreation Department.

All fees including but not limited to toll fees, parking fees, towing fees, moving violations, speeding tickets, etc. shall be the sole responsibility of the driver and/or the organization using the suburban.

#### **Payment of Funds:**

Funds, including donations, collected for the use of the van shall be paid to the Town office. These funds are needed for the repair and maintenance of the vehicle.

#### **Record Keeping:**

A mileage log shall be kept in the suburban and filled out by each and every user immediately after each use.

A passenger trip log shall be kept by each and every user that includes the name, address, and phone number of each passenger.

#### **Driver Safety:**

The driver responsible for the suburban and its passengers shall:

Schedule the use of the suburban in advance.

Complete a pre trip safety check before each day's use of the vehicle, including but not limited to checking the oil level and doing a walk around of the vehicle checking for damage.

Maintain the passenger trip log.

Assist passengers on and off the vehicle.

Collect donations to be handed in to the Town later.

Ensure seatbelts are being used by all passengers and the driver.

Refuel the vehicle after use.

#### **Passenger Safety:**

All passengers of the suburban shall:

Comply with the requests and instructions of the driver.

Wear seatbelts at all times.

Remain seated with seatbelts fastened while the vehicle is in motion.

#### **Safety Equipment:**

Due to the mountainous climate in which we live, the suburban should always be equipped with a flashlight, someone with a cell phone, water sufficient for a 24 hour period, large blankets, and a first aid kit. If you find that anything is missing or needed prior to your trip, please ask the Town for assistance.

#### Maintenance:

The Town will provide basic maintenance for the suburban, including oil and filter changes, tire replacement and rotation, and other maintenance.

#### Restrictions on travel:

Travel in the suburban shall be limited to a distance of 200 miles from Lake City. If travel is needed farther away, a user may ask for permission from the Town.

#### **Operator Insurance Requirement:**

#### **Rental Agreement:**
